A NOTE FROM MARTIN KINGSTON

Dear B4SA members and colleagues

The events of the past week or so in KwaZulu-Natal and Gauteng are of grave concern and a huge setback to both the country and our response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The loss of both lives and livelihoods has been devastating, and the state must take immediate action to end the violence and destruction.

The situation has severe consequences for controlling the pandemic: the risk that superspreading events will result in significant levels of infection and further overburdening of the healthcare system. This is particularly worrying in a setting where access to healthcare has been disrupted, which includes testing for COVID-19, oxygen supplies, and the transport and administration of vaccines.



To this end, B4SA is working closely with Government to protect staff, patients and the medical supplies and property that form part of the vaccination programme. Some vaccination sites that were damaged, or deemed to be at risk have been closed temporarily as a result.

It is now more urgent than ever that we ramp up the vaccine rollout, and remain committed to maintaining and increasing the pace of vaccination, even as we do what we can to assist businesses that have been affected and begin to rebuild. South Africa is fighting more than one battle, and we cannot allow the vaccination programme to be derailed.

The good news is that despite these challenges, we are still managing to vaccinate more than 150,000 people daily, and it is very encouraging that over a million people over the age of 35 registered for vaccination in the first 24 hours of the EVDS opening up to their age group.

People over 35 now eligible to register for vaccination

On 15 July, the EVDS officially opened to people over 35 to register for their COVID-19 vaccinations, in preparation for vaccinating this cohort from 1 August 2021.07.14

We appeal to all those eligible to register as soon as they possibly can on https://vaccine.enroll.health.gov.za and keep their vaccination appointments so that we maintain the momentum that has been built so far.



As always, please assist anyone who is eligible for vaccination and is struggling either to register, or to get to their appointment.

Security update: impact of unrest on vaccination sites

We advise businesses to work with their local community policing forums, security companies, staff, communities and other businesses in the area to assess their risk and work together to secure their sites if they are at risk.

B4SA is working with Government to help assess the situation across the country and to help ensure that vital supplies like oxygen and medicines are escorted safely to hospitals, and to assist where vital supply chains have been affected.

Caution about stolen medications and vaccines

During the riots of the past week, some pharmacies and medical centres have been looted, and their stock has been stolen. Please do not buy any medicines offered for sale by anyone other than registered medical practitioners, pharmacies or hospitals, and report any attempted sale to the SAPS immediately.

Stolen or improperly dispensed medicines are extremely dangerous as they may not have been stored properly, may be contaminated, or may cause dangerous side effects.

Reminder: Vaccine appointment scheduling

Please bear in mind that vaccinees need some warning of their vaccination appointments, to enable them to make the necessary transport and scheduling arrangements.

Official NDoH guidance requires sites to provide vaccinees with at least 72 hours' notice between receiving an SMS and presenting themselves to a vaccination site.

We recommend that all sites revise their schedules to seven days forward to allow vaccinees sufficient time to plan for their appointments and assist in the advance allocation of stock.

Users simply need to open the camera app on their mobile phone and point it at the code. A notification will open on the phone taking them directly to the site to register.
