A note from Martin Kingston

Dear B4SA and business colleagues,

We are concerned that daily vaccination numbers have been dropping off. We have sufficient vaccination supply and capacity to vaccinate in excess of 300,000 people a day, but the past week or two have seen our numbers falling well below that target.

There are a number of factors constraining take-up: lack of trust and lack of access are just two such factors, and we also know that different sections of society trust different authority figures, and find different arguments persuasive. Solving for these, and generating demand, therefore, requires a multi-pronged approach.

We know that South African leaders and institutions widely support vaccination, but many people are unaware of this, and that an effective demand strategy must mobilise social partners – government and politicians, labour, business, faith-based organisations, traditional authorities, and civil society – to create practical partnerships at all levels.

For this we need clear, public leadership to set the tone for society and their respective institutions: no single entity can do this alone. Every major constituency needs to see that “all of society” supports vaccination, and that getting a vaccination is not only a normal, accepted practice – but an important responsibility for the good of everyone in our country.

We urge you therefore, to be vocal in your support of vaccination, and the vaccination rollout. This past weekend’s initiative by the religious community shows what can be done, and events like the upcoming Vooma Vaccination Weekend are another tool in our arsenal – approximately 1,000 private sites will be open to employees and the public on Friday, and well over 500 private sector vaccination sites will be open, in all nine provinces, across the high-risk districts identified by the Department of Health.

Please consider how you can support these kinds of drives, and add your own, so that we can reach the goal of vaccinating at least 70% of the adult population by December, and in so doing, save 20,000 lives.

Order signage for your vaccine site for Vooma Vaccination Weekend

The first Vooma Vaccination Weekend will be happening this coming weekend, as part of the strategy to accelerate demand for vaccination. The Department of Health's modellers have calculated that if we can vaccinate 70% of adults by the end of December, we will save an estimated 20,000 lives.

More than 500 private sector sites will be opening on Saturday. Please keep an eye on our daily updates and/or website, where we will share a link to the list as soon as we have it. Sites can order signage from the Demand Acceleration Task Team [here](#), and are urged to do so as soon as possible to ensure they receive their materials in time for the weekend.



New platform aims to update vaccine site info in real-time

A new webapp, KnoNow, helps users to check vaccination sites closest to them, see waiting times and find out what type of vaccine is available at a particular site. Simply put, it's Waze for vaccine sites.

KnoNow is a community driven platform and relies on information that users submit. This means that if site visitors and medical staff at sites take 20-30 seconds to update the platform, it helps other users to know what's happening at that site and plan their visits accordingly.
